Life Skills

Help your child become more independent by encouraging them to practice simple daily activities such as:

- *Buttoning and unbuttoning their shirt.
- *Folding clothes.
- *Arranging their toy shelf neatly.
- *Wearing shoes and socks independently.
- *Zipping and unzipping their school bag and wearing their clothes independently.
- *Sorting and pairing household items
- *Eating with a spoon properly.
- *Keeping books in their bag and taking them out when needed
- *Good Manners & Habits

Good manners and habits are lifelong assets. Encourage your child to practice them daily until they become a natural part of their behavior.

Revise the magical words regularly: Please, Sorry, Thank You, May I, Excuse Me Make these words a habit—and notice the positive difference!

Subject-wise Homework

1. **English Conversation** (Language Skills) Practice these simple sentences daily:

*How are you? — I am fine, thank you.

* What is your name?

* Who are you?

Ans. I am a boy / girl.

*I am thirsty.

* Please close my tiffin/ please open my tiffin.

* May I go to washroom Ma'am.

*I have finished my lunch.

3. Mathematics (Written & Oral)

* Oral - Practice counting from 1 to 10

*Help your child recognize numbers 1, 7, and 4

*Practice writing numbers 1, 7, and 4 in Maths class work notebook

(Do only 5 pages of numbers 1,4,7) – (sample will be provided in class group.)

Maths Activity:

Make flashcards for numbers 1–10 by drawing or pasting pictures of objects to represent each number.

4.English Written and Oral (Language and Fine Motor Skills):

*Help them to learn the phonic sounds of the letters L, T, I, and H (Phonic chart will be provided in class group).

*Practice writing letters L, T, I, and H in the English class work notebook (Do only 5 pages of letters sample will be provided in class group.)

Help your child learn three vocabulary words for each letter:

*L – Lion, Leaf, Lamp

*T – Tiger, Tree, Table

*I – Inkpot, Igloo, Iguana

*H – Hen, Hat, House

Activity:

Kindly help your child make flashcards of one fruit and one vegetable of their choice. Encourage them to identify and speak the names confidently.
