Teacher-Student Relationship

We have many relationships with people around us that we cherish. But the most important, loved the pure and divine relationship is that of a teacher and student. Teachers selfless love, care, and affection make it the most significant and Godly relationship. I would like to quote John Strachan's words here. He said "To this end, The Greatest asset of a school is the personality of the teacher".

Healthy, positive teacher student relationships are the foundation of great teaching it is the relationship that defines the climate in which a person is educated .The ambience in which the best in a person is elicited. When student have a positive relation with their teacher, they not only develop better social emotional skills but also learn more academic content, they have higher test scores, better grades, and are less likely to be retained in grade or referred for special education.

Positive relationship with teacher make student feel safe to explore and master difficult school tasks. They motivate students to be engaged and put effort into learning. Studies have found this positive teacher-student relationship effect at all ages, ranging from pre –school to high school. The effect is large and robust. This positive relationship have a larger effect on student learning than which curriculum or instructional approach teachers use. The effect is large for all students, but especially for student who are at risk because of abuse, neglect, parent drug use, or other problems. Through teacher-student relationship student come to see the entire school as a caring place. A positive school climate has cascading benefits for teachers as well as student. Classroom management becomes easier, teacher who have positive relationship with students have one –third fewer behaviour problems over the year. Teachers are happier and more energized about their profession.

IN CONVERSATION WITH CHETAN SHARMA



Chetan Sharma is a former Indian cricketer who played Tests and ODIs as a fast bowler for Indian Cricket Team . He was elected as chairman of Selection Committee of Indian Cricket Team in December,2020. Our joys knew no bounds when he visited our school and interacted with the budding cricketers. Ms Tridisha Barua was fortunate to have a conversation with him.

Q1) SIR you were the first Cricketer to get a HATTRICK in the WORLD CUP?

Ans : Yes, it was the first hat trick in the world cup. Before that there was no hat trick in World Cup, I was the first one and also the first to take a hat trick in one day international for India.

Q2) You were seen as someone who was very competitive. Be it with the ball or with the bat. But the Indian team as whole was not seen aggressive. Do you think that has now changed?

Ans: Yeah as it's a very commercial world now. In our days, when we were young, cricket was played for fun and not taken seriously as a profession. We all were amateurs who would do jobs in different institutions and play cricket. Now, it is just professionalism. They play cricket nearly 280 days in a year whereas in our time, we would play for six months and six months off. I played international cricket for nearly 11 years (from 1989 to 1993) and when I started playing cricket, my match fee was Rs 3000 per match and my last match fee was Rs 75,000. And now, in one international match, you get about Rs 7.5 lakh a day. In Indian Premier League (IPL), auction starts from Rs 20 lakhs and goes up to Rs 10-12 crores. This is how professionalism came and when money and popularity is involved, the kid has to be very competitive. You can't give any space to anybody. In cricket, we have been taught not to leave our place. It's like politician: don't leave your chair. If you leave it once, you will come back to the end. In cricket, you step out of the line, then you have to start all over again. That's why you see much of professionalism.

Q3) There is a lot of cricket these days, league cricket and Indian Premier League (IPL). Does it affect the cricketer's performance in the national team?

Ans: They can rest if they want. The BCCI (Board for Control of Cricket in India) doesn't say no to rest. But who wants to leave when there is so much money involved, so much fame. The BCCI has given straight instructions that if you don't feel upto the mark, you email us and we will give rest. But who would want to sit out. I told you people don't want to leave the line. In our time, a cricketer would play for 12-15 years but these days they play for 5 years. They make so much money in that time and it's good. You must be hearing stories like a former hockey player now selling item in a pushcart. Sportsmen of those days are still struggling. I always feel that if we have to tell parents that you put your children in sports, then there should be something in it.

Parent should be able to see and sense a future for their children. If my child succeeds in sports, then he she or he will not struggle in life. They should be able to see this. Today a when a child succeeds as a sportsperson, he or she makes a bright future for the successive generation in his family. Nowadays, we have to pass instructions that parents should stay out of the ground. More than fathers, we see mother's pushing their children. I run an international ground in Faridabad where I train about 150 kids. I face so much pressure from people who call up and say take my kid. Sometimes they call my wife to refer a particular kid. Such is the craze for sports these days I think it's good. I believe even if a child doesn't play international level, his health will be good. There are so many diversions like Facebook and WhatsApp, then there is drugs. So, when a child is engaged in sports, we can channelize their energies. Students are also scared of their coach and that's why they become disciplined, good in health and comes out as good citizens in the country.

Q4) We had seen controversy regarding Hardik Pandya and K L Rahul's comments regarding women. Do you think there should be gender sensitization?

Ans: Yes it's very important. As we say our sanskar (values) and education are very important. If education is there, you know what to speak, respect women and uphold values. It's not as though you have earned a lot of money and can do what you like. The BCCI has taken strict action and the players have lost crores of rupees and they were lucky to be in the World Cup.

They have fined Rs 20 lakhs but since they were young, they were given a second chance. It has sent a message down the line that we have let you go but won't spare a second time.

See now I am 50 and if I see a youngster of 20-22 years making a mistake, it is my duty to correct him. But at the same time, I should keep in mind that I shouldn't be so strict that I spoil his career. This was the thought behind what the BCCI has done but the message is gone.

Next time, it can be anybody but they won't be spared. And I think the BCCI has taken the right step.

Q5) Sir, the theme for our magazine this year is peace and tolerance. Do you think cricket can promote peace?

Ans: Yes certainly sports is known to promote peace . Yes, we do say India-Pakistan match is like a war but it's not a war at the end of the day, when the match finishes, the conversation is very normal. We don't favour war. I always believe that we have one life. So, I believe live and we should let live. As a sportsman, I believe in the philosophy of peace.

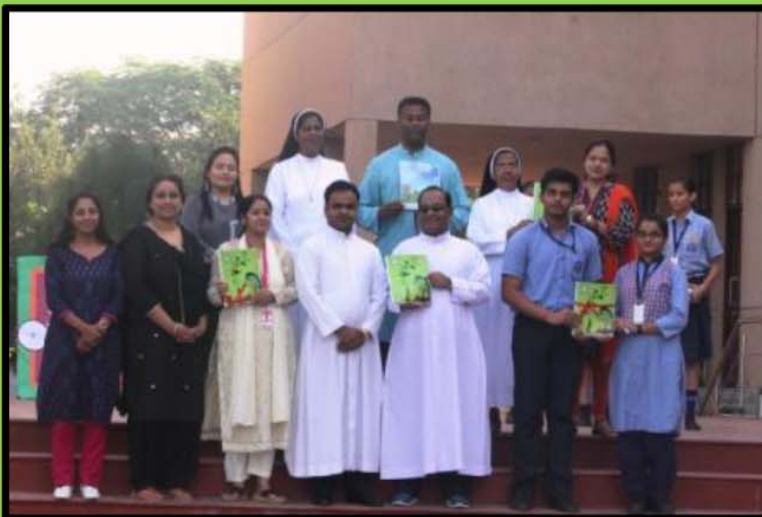
Q6) Finally, sir what's your message to our young students?

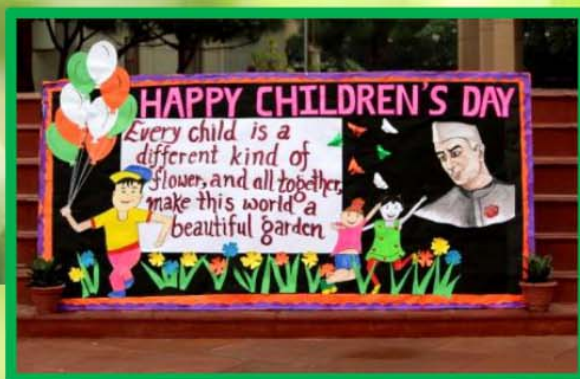

It's a great blessing to teach, a great responsibility, a great joy too... but most importantly teaching is a learning experience for the teacher too. She learns to be more patient, loving, caring, and selfless; the purpose of her life is to make a positive difference in someone else's life.

Nursery children are really small. They come to school to learn the content of the syllabus alright, but more importantly, they come to school to learn fitting into this world that is all new to them. I love children; and so with love, as well as with the other necessary ingredient of education, which is discipline, I carried out the marvellous duty of being their teacher.

The children give their lives into the hands of the teacher and every teacher has to also give her life unto them, for their welfare. My throat became sore, sleeping became difficult, it seemed at times there was too much to do on the shoulders, but by God's grace, day by day children improved academically and I gained more experienced. The greatest hardship for me was to discover the best methods of teaching, so that in the large group each individual child learns.

There are many memorable moments with my Nursery children, few of which I would like to share:

It was hilarious as well as shocking to see how little children weep for their parents in the first few weeks of joining Nursery class. A boy, who later on became a star in my class, during his first two or three weeks in Nursery, stood up on the chair to peep outside the window and kept crying about when his father would come. A girl during her first few weeks in Nursery, wailed “Mumma!” for the first half of the day then became normal for the other half of the day and now she dances, smiles and studies well too. This same girl kept on sobbing good-byes to her brother, who is one year elder to her, when they went to separate classes in the morning. Later on, after adjusting in Nursery, she just once said good-bye to him smartly every morning and sat on her chair in the class.

On some days a few children got a flower for their teacher, but the teacher had to instruct them not to pluck flowers from the school premises. Writing a red smiley in their books for doing neat work brought a smile on the child's face. One tiny three year old stayed back with me till senior student's dispersal because his mother is a teacher too. This boy is younger to his classmates, very small in size, but exceptionally smart. His talks, as well as his naughtiness, were endless.

Nursery children learn naturally by role modelling or imitating their teacher and it is a great joy to see them having memorised their syllabus in this way. Whenever time permits the teacher and the children to have informal conversation, one can expect a little boy or a girl to come and remark "I saw a dinosaur in the mall" or "My didi, bhaiya, friend and I bathed in the rain yesterday". In general, voice of a little child is soft and words are not always clearly spoken so you have to ask them to speak again to understand what they said and give back an interesting reply. Everyday requires of a teacher to be the best of herself; trying to exhibit good behaviour herself so that the children emulate those good qualities too.

I'm grateful to all teachers for being very kind, instructive and supportive throughout. They helped me learn how to effectively teach the syllabus, discipline the children, do crafts-work and much more. Also, I realised that pre-primary teachers are very lucky because they interact daily with little angels. What the senior students consider their normal behaviour was taught to them by their early year teachers. From asking permission to drink water, to basic reading and writing skills, to developing upright moral values; pre-primary education lays foundation for life ahead. But it is essential for the senior students to know, that over the years of growing up, the wonderful attitudes that are natural to the Nursery children: of simplicity, humility, fidelity, faith, purity, obedience, all these should not be lost.

Teaching Nursery is one of the best opportunities for sharing one's love, knowledge and experience with little children but also of learning to become a better human being.

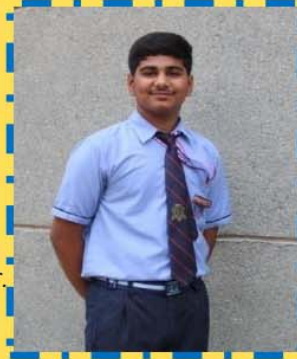

String Theory



String theory is a set of attempts to model the four known fundamental interactions gravitation, electromagnetism, strong nuclear force, weak nuclear force-together in one theory. Einstein had sought a unified field theory to explain the fundamental interaction within one model revealing the mechanics of the universe.

According to superstring theory, there are at least 10 dimensions in the universe(M-theory actually suggests that there are 11 dimensions to space-time; bosonic string theories suggest 26 dimensions)

The key theorist behind these early models would probably be Gabriele Veneziano. The string theories turned out to be the wrong model for hadron physics, but were later adapted to their present role as a theory of all elementary particles by a number of theorists. This theory describes the fundamental level of the universe in terms of vibrating strings rather than particles. A fine-dimensional space is a space with fine dimension. It interpreted physically that is one more than the usual three spatial dimensions and the fourth dimensions of time used in relativistic physics.

String theory explains our universe is made up of strings instead of particles, where length of the string is 1.6×10^{-31} m. It also describes how these strings propagate through space and interact with each other.

Leonard Susskind is widely regarded as one of the fathers of string theory, having with Yoichiro Nambu and Holger Bech Nielsen, independently introduced the idea that particles could in fact be states of excitation of a relativistic string. He was the first to introduce the idea of the string theory landscape in 2003.

In string theory and related theories such as supergravity theories, a brane is a physical object that generalizes the notion of a point particle to higher dimension. Branes are dynamical objects which can propagate through space-time according to the rules of quantum mechanics.

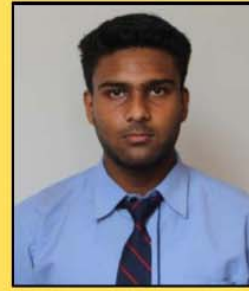
Yes! Got it now!

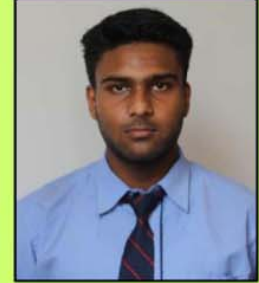

‘ घर से शिक्षण नई चुनौती और अवसर ’

कोरोना! कोरोना ! की यह चीत्कार वर्ष 2020 में आरंभ हुई। और अभी तक चल रही है। देखते ही देखते पूरे विश्व को इस महामारी ने अपने आगोश में ले लिया। इसके प्रभाव से छोटा हो या बड़ा कोई देश अछूता न रह पाया। लाखों की संख्या में जनहानि हुई। दुनिया के बड़े से बड़े देश आज सुनसान हैं बाहर के उन्माद से दूर। लोग आज अपने घरों में कैद हैं। यह सब एक विषाणु के कारण हुआ।

इस महामारी के समक्ष सभी देशों ने अपने घुटने टेक दिए हैं। संपूर्ण विश्व के हवाई अड्डे ढो बंदरगाह हो या सिनेमाघर ढों होटल ढो यहा तक कि शिक्षण संस्थान भी संपूर्ण लॉकडाउन के चलते बंद कर दिए गए। जिस कारण पूरी की पूरी अर्थव्यवस्था चरमरा गई । इससे भारत भी अछूता नहीं रह पाया है। इस स्थिति में रोटी कपड़ा और मकान जो हमारी मूलभूत आवश्यकताएं हैं , उनकी आपूर्ति करना सरकार की पहली प्राथमिकता है। किंतु हमें यह नहीं भूलना चाहिए कि बच्चों की शिक्षा उनका मूलभूत अधिकार है। इसे किसी भी स्थिति में नहीं रुकना चाहिए। कवि विश्वनाथ की यह पंक्तियां इस भयावह परिवेश में सटीक मालूम होती हैं—

है याद हमें जब युग-युग से मां ,
जिस पर बैठ , करती थी सुख से शासन ,
पर कालचक्र की गति से , टूट गया वह सिंहासन ।।

अर्थात विद्या की देवी सरस्वती का सिंहासन रूपी विद्यालय कालचक्र अर्थात महामारी द्वारा टूट गया है। अतः छात्र शिक्षक दोनों छिन्न-भिन्न हो गए हैं।

शिक्षाविदों और तकनीकी विशेषज्ञों द्वारा। शिक्षा को फिर से सिंहासन पर बिठाने का प्रयत्न किया गया। पाठशाला की धारणा बदल कर घर को शिक्षा अभ्यास का केंद्र बनाने की मुहिम प्रारंभ हुई। अब क्या था विद्यालय के प्रबंधक द्वारा शिक्षकों को यह बताना कि शिक्षक अपने पाठ को यूट्यूब वीडियो के माध्यम से छात्रों को शिक्षित करना है। यह सुनकर बहुत से शिक्षक जो तकनीकी ज्ञान से अनभिज्ञ थे उनको खासी परेशानी का सामना करना पड़ा। उनमें से एक मैं भी थी। अब तो यह आपदा मुझे और भी बड़ी लगने लगी क्योंकि मुझे कोई तकनीकी ज्ञान ना था। मन में प्रश्न यही उठा कैसे बनाऊंगी ? नेट भी कम रीचार्ज कराया है परंतु थोड़ी देर में मेरे भीतर का शिक्षक जाग उठा। मैंने उसी समय विचार किया तो क्या हुआ ? सीखेंगे क्योंकि जब कभी भी आपके समक्ष चुनौतियां खड़ी होंगी , उसमें बहुत बड़ा अवसर भी छिपा होगा जिसे ढूंढ कर निकाल

कर उपयोग कर लें तो चुनौती को अवसर में बदलने में समय नहीं लगेगा। इस आधुनिक तकनीक को मैंने सीखा और इसी चुनौती को मानकर मैंने कार्टून द्वारा वीडियो बनाने सीखे। जिससे छात्र वह छात्राएं खूब प्रभावित हुए उससे अधिक प्रभावित मैं स्वयं अपने आप पर थी कि मैंने इस अत्याधुनिक तकनीकी को कुछ ही पल में सीख लिया। परंतु अभी चुनौतियां बहुत थी। कई अभिभावक इस शिक्षा को शिक्षा मानने को तैयार ना थे। हमारी घर में 15 घंटे की की गई कड़ी मेहनत उन्हें 10 मिनट के वीडियो में रास नहीं आ रही थी। विद्यालय में शिक्षा ना हो पाने के कारण अभिभावकगण अपना मोर्चा स्थापित कर रहे थे कि हम विद्यालयों को शिक्षण शुल्क नहीं देंगे, जबकि ऐसे परिवेश में और किया भी क्या जा सकता था ?

और अब हमारे शिक्षकों का वेतन भी आधा हो चुका था। खैर गर्मियों की छुट्टियां हुई। तत्पश्चात जुलाई से ऑनलाइन शिक्षण की घोषणा हुई। अब नई चुनौती फिर से आ खड़ी हुई। अब फोन या लैपटॉप की आवश्यकता ने मुझे परेशान कर दिया था क्योंकि मैं पढ़ाऊंगी और मेरा बेटा भी पढ़ेगा। दोनों को फोन की आवश्यकता है। एक-दो दिन में नया फोन लाया गया। वेतन आधा हो रहा था और खर्चे बढ़ रहे थे। अब हम वीडियो से ऑनलाइन शिक्षण पर आ गए थे। परंतु हास्यास्पद बात तो यह है कि इसमें बच्चे कम और अभिभावक स्वयं ही शिक्षकों का अवलोकन कर रहे थे। परंतु सांच को आंच क्या ? धैर्य और विवेक शिक्षा का अंग है जो हर शिक्षक में होना चाहिए। इन्हीं मूल्यों ने मेरा उत्साह बनाए रखा और एक शिक्षिका होने के नाते उन्हें सही दिशा-निर्देश देने का प्रयत्न करती रही। परंतु शास्त्रों में ठीक ही कहा है :—

मुंडे मुंडे मतरा भिन्ने ,

कुंडे कुंडे नवम् पयम्।

अर्थात् मुंड मुंड में अर्थात् अलग-अलग सिर में अलग-अलग ही बुद्धि होती है और हर कुएं में पानी भी अलग होता है। इसी प्रकार हर इंसान अपनी बुद्धि द्वारा ही सोच सकता है। क्योंकि अब इस ऑनलाइन शिक्षा में भी कुछ अभिभावकों की असहमति आगे आ रही थी। जबकि छात्र इसका लाभ उठा रहे थे।

कुछ ना से कुछ तो संभव हो रहा था। और आगे धीरे-धीरे छात्रों की संख्या बढ़ती गई और छात्र भी अपने सभी कार्य व्हाट्सएप के माध्यम से हमें भेजते गए। तब लगने लगा

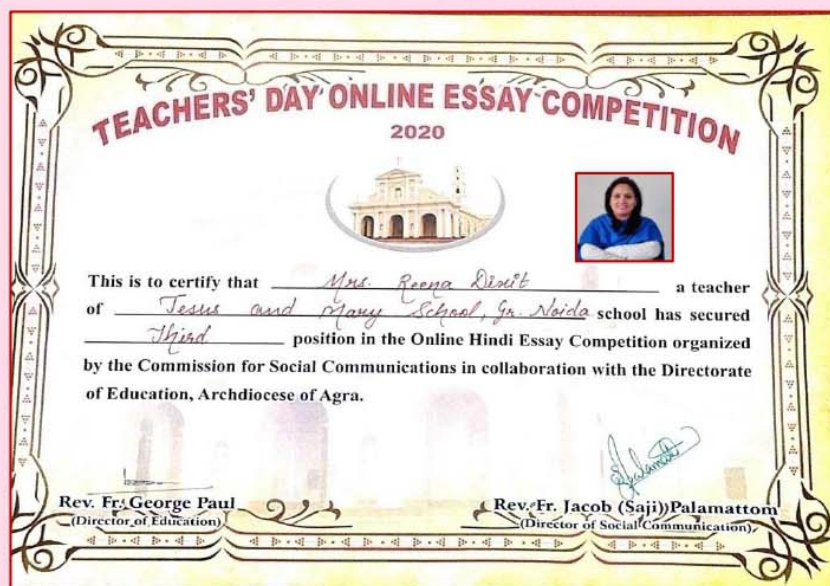

इन दिनों मुझे यह अवश्य लगा कि हम अपने छात्रों को नैतिक मूल्य अवश्य दें। उन्हें सिखाएं की आपदाओं से ही जीवन महान होता है। श्री राम हो या श्री कृष्ण हो या फिर जीसस हो , यह सभी आपदाओं से जूझ कर ही महान बने। जो अभिभावक शिक्षकों द्वारा झेली गई चुनौतियों की अनदेखी करते हुए , कहते हैं कि आप कर ही क्या रहे हैं जो हम **फीस** दे ? ऐसे अभिभावकों को मूल्यपरक शिक्षा मिलनी ही चाहिए। शिक्षा चाहे विद्यालय से हो या ऑनलाइन हो। शिक्षा का उद्देश्य स्पष्ट है- सही दिशा में शिक्षा। शिक्षक **ही** है जो जन चेतना का विस्तार कर रहे हैं। हम शिक्षक हैं हम हर चुनौती में अवसर निकाल ही लेंगे। और हम जानते हैं यह अंधेरा जल्दी ही छटेगा क्योंकि रात के बाद उजाला अवश्य होता है। किसी शायर ने **खूब** कहा है कि -

आपदा में अवसर

Teaching from home - The new challenges and opportunities.

‘The world is shut down but education knows no lockdown’ This sentence truly reflects the responsibilities of a teacher as an educationist. The only constant in life is change. Change is bound to happen, so why not accept it as a challenge?

From picking up a chalk to picking up video classes, from correcting the notebooks physically to virtually checking them, taking online exams, it has been a virtual journey. This seems to be the new norm for a teacher. COVID 19 has verily posed several challenges in the lives of many of us.

Neither the teachers nor the school had any clarity on what tools and technologies were to be used, so, the situation appeared as a challenge rather than an opportunity for the schools, teachers, parents, and the students. While the schools and the teachers were at the giving end whereas the parents were at the receiving end. As there was a threat to continue with formal teaching, the schools had no choice but to go online. So, it turned out to be an opportunity for the teachers, to brush up and leap forward.

It was time to think of all different possibilities to reach out to the students, so that their education, moreover an academic year does not go waste. It was also important to keep the children engaged for the betterment of their physical and mental health. Otherwise, it would turn out to be a nightmare to most of the parents because the children were facing a difficult situation as they were stuck up at home, not allowed to move out or not even allowed to play with their friends.

We all were asked to jot down our ideas to overcome the issue. At that time, the already existing school apps came handy. In the beginning, we started to upload videos through ‘Youtube’. It was not as easy a task as it seemed to be. We had to make ppts, notes, and then do the screen recordings along with the audio. It was also time-consuming to select the best of them all, as we had to remake the complete video, even for the slightest error.

Again after the vacation, as per the government’s decision, taking live classes became mandatory. So, there was again a new demand in front of the teachers. I am sure that every teacher accepted the fact and as a responsible citizen, the teachers took up the new task with great devotion. The existing apps were also not sufficient to fulfill all the requirements, to host everything online. So, again they had to be upgraded. At this time the schools might have tried at least one or two different apps that would serve as the platform to conduct online classes effectively, so the teachers might have had to switch between two different apps within a short time.

At the very beginning of these online classes, I used to feel uncomfortable and had constant anxiety but now I feel I have begun to enjoy it. Now, I realize that teaching online is not more difficult than teaching offline but an online class needs constant preparation and use of modern technology (video or audio or mixed) to connect with the students. Organizing online classes involves more personal research compared to regular classes. The success lies in keeping them engaged, to ignite their interests and make them feel enthusiastic during the class. So, it is important to make it interactive, let some creativity flow in, also keep self-assessing, and also use proper teaching aids to grab their attention.

We also post a summarized video on Youtube after completion of the chapter. This is especially for those students who miss out on the online classes. As compared to my earlier classes, I have developed my skills in better time management. To exemplify, I try to send 'the next topics to be done' a day before to the entire class and also I constructively use the 5 to 8 minutes buffer time before the actual start of the class, where I give them a certain task to read, solve and find answers, so that all the children who are punctual remain engaged. Also, trying to interact with them personally as much as possible, like giving opportunities roll number wise, to ensure that each one of them gets a chance to speak, asking a child to stay back after the class for any personal talks or even for clearing their doubts.

After we started the live classes, we also had to connect with the parents in a better way, so the need to create what's app groups became inevitable, so as the requirement, all the teachers willingly made their class groups. Now, the parents were free to message anytime or call the teachers, even after giving them some specified time for interacting with the teacher.

Sometimes, it is very difficult to convince a parent that a teacher is helpless to solve connectivity issues. Some parents fail to understand these problems and most often blame the teacher or the system. Most of the time the notes sent by us are deleted by the parents or children and demand it over and over again. The messages that we communicate in English is not understood by many parents, so they either do not understand it or misunderstand it.

No doubt, due to online classes, all the stakeholders have to lend more time and efforts but all these challenges have turned out to be an opportunity to learn something fresh and new. Online teaching is going to be the present and future of the education system. It has given us a new outlook on life. It is a lesson for every individual to be patient, caring, using the resources judiciously, and also employ technology to save time and travel. So, we are more active than before and now I can proudly say that I have been groomed in a better way and I have kept a step forward towards a futuristic classroom.

In my opinion, though online training is an upcoming platform, yet it cannot take the place of classroom teaching. I miss the murmuring and the smiling faces of my students, fragrance of the chalk & the duster too. I miss the school bell, smiling faces of my colleagues. There is a never-ending list. Nevertheless, I hope that very soon we will overcome this pandemic and restart conventional classroom teaching. It is truly a great learning experience.
